Traditional art forms such as Madhubani and Warli introduce cultural appreciation.

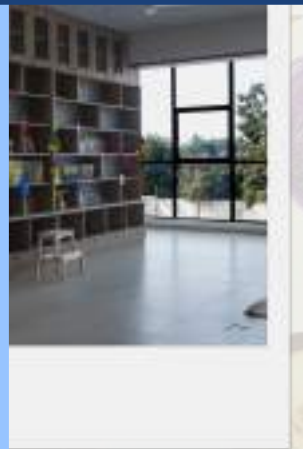

Robotics

Robotics is the branch of the computer science, the mechanical engineering, and the electrical engineering that deals with the construction, the design, the operation and the application of robots as well as the computer systems for their control, sensory feedback, and information processing. Our students got to explore and get educated about:

The educational robots to strengthen and support the students skills, and they develop their knowledge through the creation, the design, the assembly and the operation of robots.

The educational robotics were very useful in learning that they improve the design and construction of creation which are given in the first instance and later mental form in the physical form.

The creation by using robotics is built with different types of materials which are controlled by a computer system. So, they are called the prototypes or the simulations.

Teaching robotics adapted the students to the current production processes which is related to the use of the mechanical, the electronic and the computer-based, in the operation and control of the production.

Library

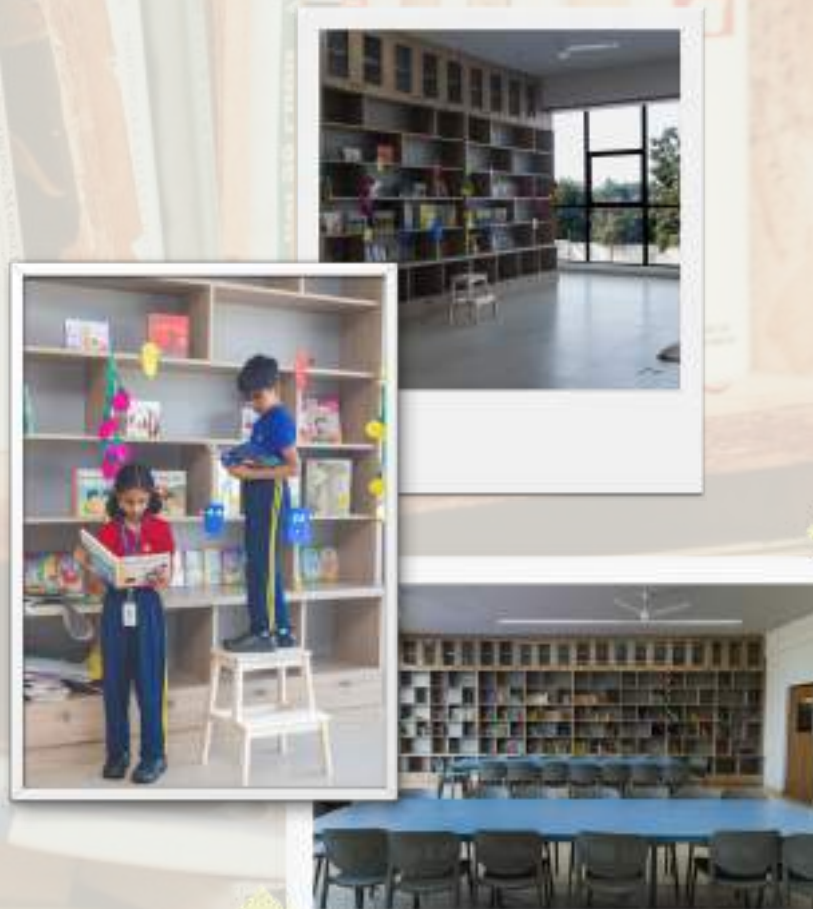

It gives us immense pleasure to share that the students of The Shri Ram Universal School, Bengaluru have performed exceptionally well in the 2025-26 Olympiads conducted by the Science Olympiad Foundation. Our learners participated enthusiastically in the National Science Olympiad (NSO), International Mathematics Olympiad (IMO), and International English Olympiad (IEO), and their results have been truly commendable.



In the NSO, 15 students secured the Gold Medal of Excellence as Class Toppers. Similarly, in the IMO, 15 students achieved Class Topper Gold Medals, showcasing their strong conceptual understanding and analytical skills. The IEO results were equally heartening, with 17 students earning the Gold Medal of Excellence and attaining notable international and zonal ranks.
